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# **How To Maximize Surrogacy Success Rates Using a Surrogate Mother:**



## **Option 1: Using the Parents Own Sperm and Eggs, Having a Surrogate carry Embryo.**

Here are the success rates for surrogacy nationwide in the USA based on the age of the intended mother using her own eggs and a surrogate mother:

- Age 20-24: 67.9%
- Age 25-29: 64.3%
- Age 30-34: 59.5%
- Age 35-39: 52.9%
- Age 40-44: 39.7%
- Age 45-49: 19.4%



It is important to note that these are just averages, and the actual success rate for any individual may vary.

**At our agency we do not recommend using your own eggs if you are over 39 years of age. Instead use an egg donor under 30 years of age to maximize success rates.**

# Recommendations to maximize success.



According to SART, the average live birth rate for gestational surrogacy using an egg donor in the United States is 64.7% per transfer. This means that for every 100 embryos transferred, an average of 64.7 babies will be born.

To maximize success:

- ✓ Pick an egg donor 20 to 29 years of age that has been screened properly.
- ✓ Suggest using frozen eggs that are prescreened to be M2 quality, FDA screening passed, and genetically screened.
- ✓ Use top quality sperm from a donor bank that has been prescreened.
- ✓ If you use your own sperm, use ICSI. Then have the embryos that are created genetically screened using PGD.
- ✓ Ensure you create at least four, 5-day old blastocyst embryos .so you have enough for a second try. IVF doctors typically place two embryos at each try. We recommend you start with twelve frozen eggs. These should give you enough embryos to work with.
- ✓ Use only the two best quality day 5-day old blastocyst embryos created for the first try.
- ✓ Select a surrogate mother that is under 35 years of age.
- ✓ Ensure the surrogate is properly screened by the gynecologist.
- ✓ Ensure the surrogate is properly prepared with the right medications at the time and date of transfer of the embryos.
- ✓ Then say a prayer for success!

Following this protocol will maximize your likelihood of having a beautiful healthy baby!
